Our value for February is trust. We will be talking about what it means to trust someone, who we can trust and how we can be trustworthy.

It is important that children are aware of how important it is to be someone who others can trust. We have been looking at different stories which show good examples of being trustworthy and how this is part of being a good friend. Maybe you have one at home you can bring in to share with your class?

Who can you trust?

As children get older it is important that they have an understanding of who they can trust, without being fearful of all strangers.

Why not draw a picture together of familiar people you can trust (e.g. friends, family, teachers)? Then talk to your child about 'safer strangers' who they could talk to if they were lost or in trouble. It might be useful to talk about places they could go if they needed to find a 'safer stranger' like a shop or library. Older children can be helped to learn their phone number and address, explaining who they should tell this information to and when.
